

Lab 11: Web Page

Goal: Learn about HTML and CSS, have some fun, and be creative.

Instructions:

1. Open your U network drive. If there is not already a directory called “public_html”, make one.
2. Save a file in your U:\public_html folder called “lab11.html”. (You must use that file name exactly, with a lowercase “lab”, followed by the number 11, followed by a dot, and the letters html. If you change anything, we will not find your file, and you will get a zero grade on the lab.)
3. Make a web page using what we have learned about html and css. You must have style data embedded in the head section of this file. The content of the web page can be whatever you find interesting... maybe what your plans are for a Covid-19 summer, or your favorite hobby, or proposals for on-line sororities or fraternities, or what you liked and hated about CS-105. Write whatever you want to, but your web page needs to implement the following html constructs:
 - a. At least two levels of heading (h1-h6)
 - b. Paragraphs
 - c. Ordered and Unordered lists
 - d. A table with at least two rows and two columns
 - e. At least one example of div and span
 - f. At least one tag which we have NOT discussed in class
 - g. Your name.

We expect to see different colors, different fonts, different text sizes, so you will have to override the default style. We expect your web page to look good even if we change the web browser window size.

You can look at your web page in the browser using the URL:

`http://harveyv.binghamton.edu/~userid/lab11.html`

where *userid* is your PODS userid.

4. Note that you will NOT have to turn anything in to myCourses, because we can load your page in our web browser as soon as you save it. You may modify your web page up to the time we grade it, which will be after the due date, but your grade will be based on how the web page looks like when the grading occurs.
